**Tips Lead to Arrests in Pharmacy Robberies**  
*Anonymous Tipster(s) to Receive Up to \$1,000 Reward*

**Huntington, WV–February 25th, 2008** - Two men suspected of robbing local pharmacies in the Huntington area were arrested as a result of a reward offer issued by *RxPATROL*<sup>®</sup>/*Crime Stoppers*. Based on anonymous tips, the Huntington Police identified and arrested Adam Daniels and James Henry Worden as suspects in connection with these robberies. During his arrest, Worden reached for a weapon and was subsequently shot and killed by police. Daniels remains in police custody. All suspects are deemed innocent until proven guilty.

On February 6th, *RxPATROL/Crime Stoppers* offered a cash reward of up to \$1,000 for information that could help the police investigation of the pharmacy robbery at the Budget Pharmacy at 361 Norway Ave on January 25<sup>th</sup> and Fruth Pharmacy at 125 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue on February 3<sup>rd</sup>.

“We received several calls from residents after issuing the alert on the robberies,” said Detective C. Perry. “We appreciate the commitment made by *RxPATROL* to assist us with the reward offer. These suspects may not have been apprehended as quickly without the information we received through these tips.”

Purdue Pharma, L.P. developed *RxPATROL* (Rx Pattern Analysis Tracking Robberies & Other Losses) in 2003 as a collaborative effort between industry, pharmacists and law enforcement to collect, collate, analyze and disseminate information on pharmacy theft. In 2005, Purdue partnered with *Crime Stoppers* and affiliated local anti-crime programs throughout the country to offer rewards for information that can help lead to the arrest of pharmacy robbery suspects.

This arrest follows several others in West Virginia and other states throughout the country. To date, 61 arrests have been made as a result of the partnership between Purdue’s *RxPATROL* program and local *Crime Stoppers* affiliated programs.

“We are proud to support the efforts of *Crime Stoppers* and affiliated programs throughout the United States,” said *RxPATROL* program coordinator Capt. Richard Conklin. “The identification of these suspects in this case proves that tips from local residents really can make a difference.”

All information that comes into any *Crime Stoppers* tip line is kept completely confidential. Callers never have to give their names or appear in court.
